Publicity Director's Report

The Northwest Arkansas Daylily Society (NWADS) will host the 2020 Regional Meeting in Fayetteville, Arkansas, June 19 and 20. A formal more detailed announcement is coming once completion of our negotiations with a hotel, bus service, and caterers are complete.

Traditional events, such as the auction, a guest hybridizer presentation, and Garden Judges Workshops will be offered. There will be a Region 13 Hybridizer bed, with online voting and voting by attendees. We plan to tour five area gardens Saturday.

In addition to the regular gardens, the Botanical Garden of the Ozarks (BGO) has agreed to provide a 100' x 16' area for a daylily display bed. Those of you who have been to Baton Rouge and have seen the work of Claire Fontenot with their botanical garden recognize how important a display bed can be to attract people to daylilies. This display bed will not be in the highest traffic area but is located to take advantage of plenty of peak-time sun. This bed will grow daylilies exclusively. The display bed will feature plants on the current, or upcoming, Garden Judges ballot and Honorable Mention (HM) winners from previous years that will appear on the Award of Merit Ballot. This past weekend, twenty-one previous HM winners are planted in the bed, with plans to plant an additional 50 in April. The plants are from nearby gardens and purchased directly from the hybridizers. Garden Judges in Region 13 should take advantage of the bed, as it's difficult to see a good assortment of plants on the ballot in a single garden.

I'm also asking members of Region 13 to contact me if they have sufficient growth of a cultivar on the ballot to part with a double-fan of a plant that is on 2020 Garden Judges ballot, once the ballot is made available in February. The plant will become a donation to the Botanical Garden of the Ozarks, and an acknowledgement of the donation will be sent. Please contact me (coolpanter@hotmail.com) and I'll reserve a spot for your cultivar (s).

Region 13 Hybridizers are encouraged to submit plants for the seedling competition, which will also be at the BGO. It's been in the 90s regularly, and sending plants now is not advised, nor is waiting until October for the severity of our winter is not conducive to planting bare rooted daylilies. It will be best to ship plants in the spring. The soil in the BGO is a nice silty loam, excellent for growing daylilies once the rocks are removed. The beds will receive a balanced fertilizer mixed into the soil and will be watered regularly.

Hope to see all of you in northwest Arkansas, where your vision of daylilies will be 20-20.

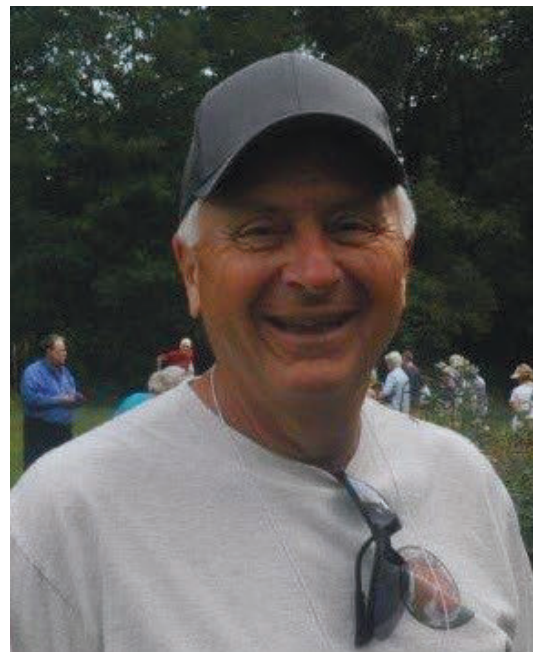

It's also a great time to obtain a soil sample from your garden to ensure your soil remains in optimum condition to support your plants through the winter and make for a plentiful 2020 bloom season.

Region 13 finances continue to be solid with an August 31, 2019 bank balance of just over \$30,000. The ending balance was a modest \$300 dollars lower than at the same point in 2018. The major source of revenue continues to be the Region 13 Business Meeting plant auction. This year \$1,460 was raised to support the ARKLA publication, which is the major expense. 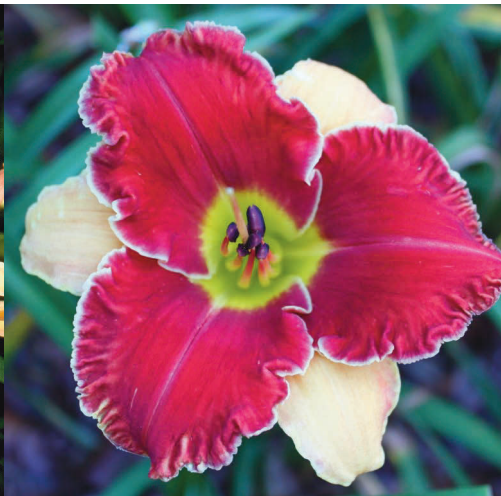

Meeting called to order by Joe Goudeau. He thanked everyone for their attendance. A Quorum was in attendance and verified against the AHS membership roster.

Motion to approve minutes as printed on page 10, Volume 3 /Issue 2 of the Fall/Winter- Region 13 Newsletter, by Carol Lazar, seconded by Annette Pressler. Vote approved unanimously

Treasurer Report: Ed Herringshaw reported that the Region has \$28,653.93.

Nominating committee Chairperson Tom Talley nominated Bob Stassen as Regional Present for 2020 - 2021 and Pat Soileau as Regional director 2020 - 2022. Nominations were opened to the floor. With no Nominations being presented the nominations were closed. Bob Stassen was elected as Regional President and Pat Soileau elected as Regional Director. Director and President were approved unanimously.

Floor was opened to elect a nominating committee, if needed, to nominate a president for 2021 – 2022 term. Nominated and approved are Tom Talley, Mary Gould and Chester McDonald.

A recommendation was made by Tom Talley to solicit ads for the ARKLA to off-set the expenses of the publication. Joe Goudeau, editor, will create a rate schedule and add to next newsletter.

With no other new business, Chris Bridges made a motion to adjourn, Carol Lazar seconded. Meeting adjourned.

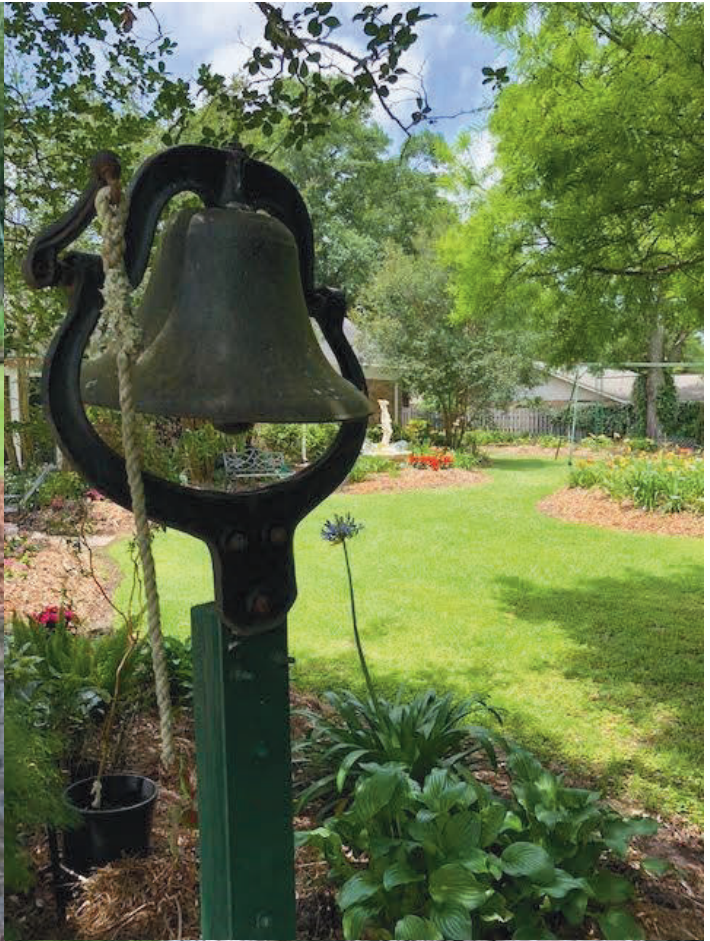

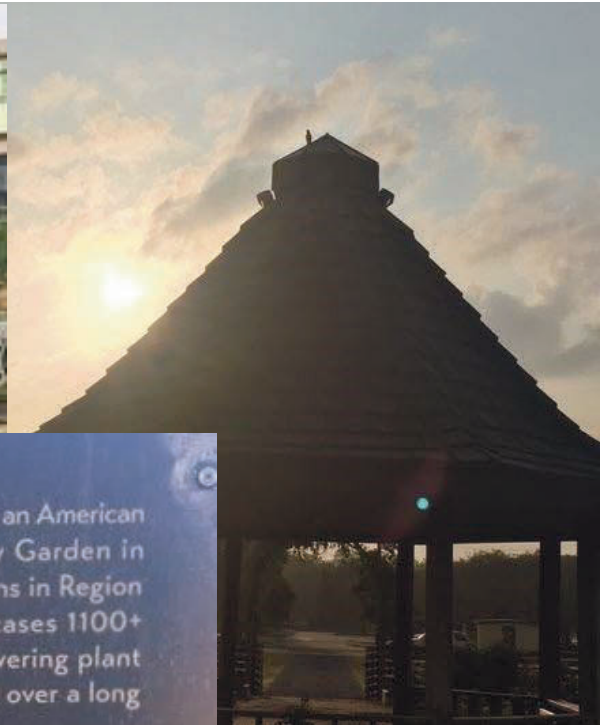
