Becoming a Garden Judge let's you share your input in cultivar improvement, and if you're in the second year as an ADS member, you should give this consideration. It adds to your interest in daylilies and appreciate the variety of plant and bloom attributes within daylilies. If you are currently a Garden Judge, and notice someone who is not on our Region's listing, offer them some encouragement on being a Garden Judge.

We would like club to consider hosting a meeting for 2023 Meeting. If your group is interested in hosting the Garden Judges Workshops, meeting, and garden tours, let me know at our meeting. These past few years, we've gone with a single morning of garden touring. The last major tour planned was in the Spring of 2020, and planning ended abruptly with COVID-19. # On Garden Judging: The Botanical Garden of the Ozarks Collection Bob Stassen, Fayetteville, Region 13 Garden Judges Liaison

In 2019, the Botanical Garden of the Ozarks (BG0) in Fayetteville, provided the Northwest Arkansas Daylily Society a 120' x 20' bed have 135 plants to date, with plans to eventually have 200 mature clumps. Our intention was providing our club's Garden Judges an additional bed to view a good sample of cultivars appearing on the American Daylily Society's Awards & Honors, and to have a bed where visiting gardeners could see a sample of the variance among modern cultivars.

The soil in the bed itself has turned out to be good, with not too many rocks. It has automatic watering, plenty of sunlight, and **importantly** in Fayetteville, sits behind an 8' woven-wire **deer fence**. Important also to the project was the BGO's cooperation, where they didn't require there to be companion plants grown, and that a pine bark mulch in the beds could address to simplify weed control. Other than times when Bermuda grass has to be kept from moving in, herbicide use is minimal. The mulch reduces the labor of annual weed control and allows heavy rains to "soak in." The BGO also agreed to an "understanding" that there would be times—like at the time of this letter, where the plants are not attractive coming out of dormancy, or later in the fall when the bloom is spotty and the foliage can look very "tired."

The bed is becoming a good introduction to daylilies for visitors to the garden, and we're thankful to the BGO for this space. On occasions when I'm out watering, usually I'm interrupted by visitors, either pleased with what I'm doing, or share some of their "history." The purpose of this note is to share experiences and the challenges with this approach to building a collection—and to remind of us of the experiences of those that may be new to daylilies — or to understand why their first experiences weren't so great.

#### Finding and Ordering Plants – Running into "For Display Only"

The ideal time to determine the plants for our bed would be in late fall, when the Honorable Mention winners are announced from the Garden Judges voting of that year, where the Garden Judges voting has ended on September 1. Electronic voting should make tabulation near automatic, and it's now possible for Judges to revisit their ballot online to revise their votes. This should definitely speed up the tabulation process.

Frequently, it is difficult to find daylilies on the ballot, in stock *anywhere*. When it comes time to putting together an ordering plants from the HM winners, few nurseries can afford to keep plants around that were introduced at least four springs earlier, and they stay on the ballot up to three years. Now I'm ordering plants from 2021 HM Winners, and because of the variance in cultivar availability, orders wind up going to nurseries with plants that are available. Consider the current limited, or absence of availability. for "Mayor of Munchkinland" or "Dances with Giraffes," the recent winners of the Stout Medal and Lenington Award.

Because of this uncertainty of finding the HM winners available in commerce, it was necessary for the BGO bed to take some chances with plants initially on the ballot as HM Nominees—as you'd expect that knowing the hybridizer, and their plants, that those to but on the HM Ballot would be also great plants. Ordering the HM Nominees is risky, but three turned out to be them were 2021 HM Winners.

#### **Receiving "Barely Alive" Plants**

Most of us are spoiled, as we buy freshly dug fans at daylily nurseries, plant sales and auctions, or trade plants with our friends, or other hybridizers. If you have these plants where you can give them attention for a week—you're assured excellent results. In contrast, some experiences should be shared with what might happen to an inexperienced grower (occasionally.) My experiences with daylily sources are that *most* ship by the US Post Office—and arrive on my west-facing doorstep, overheated, in bad shape, in need of a "recovery phase" or urgent care, when they arrive—particularly if the nursery fulfils its order in May. Each plant is given a month or so to get over the shock of being in the hands the USPS and transplanted in a 3 gal vinyl pot—so they could be transplanted into the garden. Last year, a box arrived so late, and in such poor condition, that they can transplanted only this spring. I've worked to coordinate by e-mail or phone about when they'll be sending the order, or if it can be tracked, such as with United Parcel—but nurseries are overwhelmed, it's just what happens.

#### **Growing Plants from Multiple Sources**

Thankfully, as we do know, daylilies are not difficult to grow, and respond well to watering and nitrogen in the spring. Those plants that are better growers are off to a fast start. A double-fan gives you plenty a plant in just a few season, as several cultivars that went in 2019 can be easily divided as they are no longer on the ballot. Each plant had an ounce of 10-10-10 worked into the soil with a reasonably priced soil amendment found at Lowe's, "Peat Humus." You would expect hybridizer to only place their best growers on the ballot—but there are major differences in vigor, increase, and scapes appearing across those planted.

Initially, I did not believe that there would be regular maintenance needed for daylily rust, as it's not a major problem in or area. However, the reality of obtaining young divisions from several southern nurseries in the spring, rapidly did away with this assumption, you're going to see all levels of rust prevention taken by the nurseries—and I'm not convinced this transmission can be prevented. Without question, spring planting in northwest Arkansas is preferred, as is working with nurseries that can ship in April—you're going to see rust emerge, and major differences in susceptibility.

Cultivars that may have great vigor have apparently never seen the rust pressure shown in the summer of 2020. Spraying with a fungicide did not affect an ability to see the "rust magnets." The following winter (2020-21) was much colder, and there was no rust pressure this last past year. If the bed accomplishes nothing more than letting me see the cultivars very susceptible to rust, it will have satisfied one purpose.

#### A Comparative Bed's Effect on Voting

The American Daylily Society Systems of Awards is fundamental to our status as a non-profit association and scientific and educational mission. Cultivar improvement is our essential aim. While our voting system is "positive," in that we recognize cultivars that have great habits, it might be improved if cultivars that present serious vigor concerns are quickly identified.

Initially, I believed I would have no problem finding 12 votes for Honorable Mention votes—but in fact, seeing the cultivars growing side-by-side in the garden, it was not easy to find the twelve

meriting votes—particularly seeing their growth, scape count, and rust resistance. In other words, when garden judges get to discriminate among cultivars—those meriting our vote is held down. The technology behind being able to revise a vote will allow more information to be obtained than in the past, such as indicating the cultivars he or she has seen growing, in addition to those deserving the award.

Below are HM Winners from 2021 that I'm attempting to acquire in 2022. If you want to sell the BGO any of these cultivars, let me know. They will be on the Award of Merit Ballot in 2024.

The BGO Awards & Honors bed has over 135 cultivars in different stages of the process. Many were on the HM Ballot—and never made that "cut" line of 15 votes last year. Eight plants are on the Stout Silver Medal ballot, 24 on the Award of Merit ballot and 14 on the Honorable Mention ballot. More will be added this spring. If you are the Fayetteville area, visit the bed in these early stages at the Botanical Garden. Our peak is typically the weeks from Father's Day through late June.

A portion of the Garden Judges 2022 Awards and Honors ballot is included in this newsletter. If you complete Garden Judges Workshop 1 and 2, and your application is approved in August, you'll be able to complete the ballot online. These listing are daunting, but if you are growing these plants, let a local Garden Judge see them, and encourage them to stop by.

Any cultivar registered prior to 2020 which has not previously won this award, and whose hybridizer has met requirements set forth by AHS Registration procedures, is eligible. Consider only those cultivars personally evaluated in established clumps in your own region.
